

OPERATION NOTES

Thank you for your purchase of the Lingo Global Traveler. To insure trouble-free operation, we recommend the following:

1. The Global Traveler should be kept in area free from extreme temperature changes, moisture and dust.
2. This equipment is precision-built. Do not subject your translator to strong shock by striking or dropping it.
3. A soft, dry cloth should be used to clean your translator. Do not use solvents or a wet cloth.
4. Never disassemble or attempt to repair the translator and its accessories. Keep this manual for further reference.

FEATURES

1. The **Global Traveler** translates 20 languages containing 400,000 individual words and 40,000 phrases, 20,000 words and 2,000 phrases average per language.
2. The built-in **DATABANK** stores and retrieves names, telephone numbers and memos.
3. 12 digits **CALCULATOR** with memory and percent calculations.

4. **LOCAL TIME CLOCK** specifies your local date and time. **ALARM** sounds with your preset alarm time. Alternative American or English date format, 12-hour or 24-hour format and summer daylight saving time.
5. **WORLD TIME** shows the date and time in one of 200 major cities around the world.
6. **CURRENCY CONVERSION** functions as a currency converter for 8 denominations of your choices.
7. **METRIC CONVERSION** converts automatically 8 different types of measurement.
8. International **SIZES** for **CLOTHES/SHOES**.
9. **LIGHT/DARK DISPLAY** allows you a choice of 11 levels of contrast for the display.
10. **PERSONAL PASSWORD** allows you to lock your databank memory.
11. **86 x 32 DOTS MATRIX DISPLAY**.
12. **AUTOMATIC POWER OFF** conserves battery power by turning off the Global Traveler after 2 minutes.

BATTERY

The Global Traveler is powered by two AAA batteries as the main power supply, and one CR2032 lithium battery as the databank memory. When the power level of the batteries is low, the display will show <LOW BATTERY>. If this happens, replace the 2xAAA alkaline batteries immediately. The actual battery life depends on the batteries used.

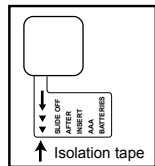
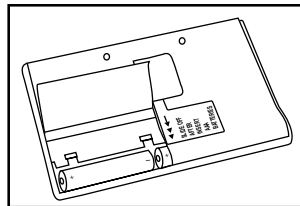
We recommend:

- Always keep 2 pcs AAA batteries in the Global Traveler otherwise the backup battery for databank will be used.
- Replace the 2 pcs AAA batteries supplied with the unit not longer than 3 months after purchasing.
- Be sure that the positive and negative poles of each battery are facing in the proper direction.
- Never mix batteries of different types.
- Never mix old batteries and new ones.
- Never leave dead batteries in the battery compartment.

Replacing the AAA batteries:

Do not remove the isolation tape of backup battery from the Translator while AAA batteries are removed.

- a) Turn off the machine.
- b) Slide off the battery door according the direction of the arrow indicated. The battery door is attached to translator case.
- c) Remove the old batteries and replace 2 PCS AAA batteries (1.5 V, SUM-4, R3) in the correct polarity corresponding to the symbol indicated inside the battery compartment.
- d) Make sure that the batteries make good contact with the metal plates.
- e) Cover the battery door.

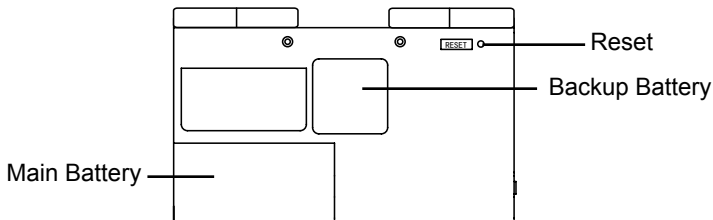


Replacing the databank memory backup battery:

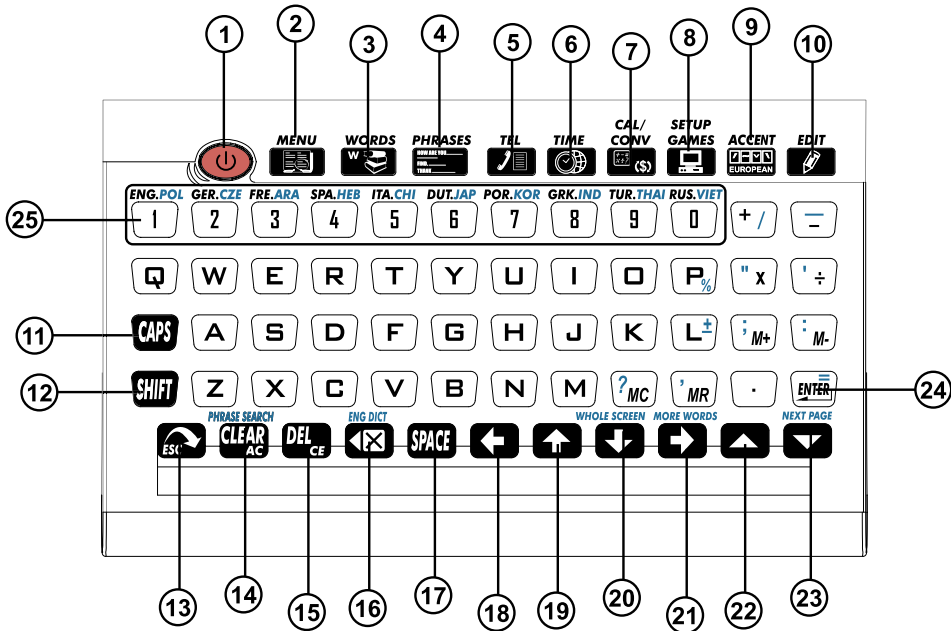
Before replacing the memory backup battery, Do not remove the 2 pcs AAA batteries from the Global Traveler while memory backup battery is removed. Otherwise, the memory in your databank will be lost during the battery replacement. Be sure to replace the memory backup battery at least once a year.














1. Turn off the machine.
2. Unscrew the battery cover and replace the old battery with a new one. Wipe the surface of the battery with a soft, dry cloth. Make sure that the positive(+) side of the battery is facing up.
3. Replace the battery compartment cover and fasten it with the screw.

NAME OF KEYS

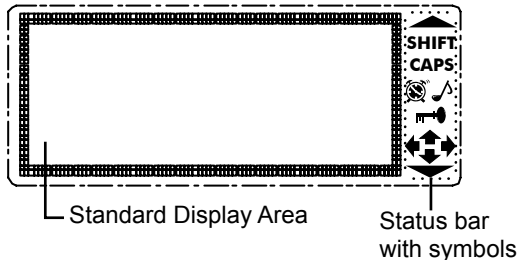








1. ON/OFF  : Turn on & off. The Global Traveler will automatically switch off if you do not press any keys 2 minutes .
2. MENU  : Main menu interface.
3. WORDS  : Enter single word.
4. PHRASES  : Enter category to access 2,000 phrases.
5. TEL/MEMO  : Personal data assistant.
6. DATE/TIME  : Press once to go to Local Time mode.
Press twice to go to World Time mode.
7. CAL/CONV  : Press once to go to Calculator mode.
Press twice to go to Conversion mode.
8. SETUP/GAME  : Press once to go to Setup Mode.
Press twice to go to Game Mode.
9. ACCENT  : When you are in European input, press this key to get the European. When you are in Chinese input, press this key to select the Chinese input method. There are two input methods in Chinese. When you are in Japanese input, press this key to select the Japanese Input method. There are two input methods in Japanese.
10. EDIT  : Press this key to amend data.
11. CAP  : Press once to get capital letter; press again to return to lower case letters.
12. SHIFT  : Shift to get other letter apart from main letter.
13. ESC  : Press this key to return to last screen.

14. CLEAR / AC : a) To clear the whole input in the translator mode.
 b) To erase data in databank mode.
 c) As the 'AC' key in Calculator mode.
 d) In phrases mode, press this key to clear the screen and input your word to search a right sentence.

15. DEL / CE : a) Delete, to delete the letter with cursor.
 b) As the "CE" key in calculator mode.
- 
16. Backspace : a) To clear the last input.
 b) Press this key to access Dictionary.
- 
17. SPACE : Adds a space.
- 
18. Left key : To move the cursor left.
- 
19. Up key : To move the cursor up.
- 
20. Down key : To move the cursor down; or to see whole screen.
- 
21. Right : To move the cursor right; or to see more words from the database.
- 
22. Pg Up : Page Up key, to move the screen to the last page.
- 
23. Pg Dn : Page Down key, to move the screen to the next page.
- 
24. ENTER : a) Press this key to have translation in Translator mode.
 b) Press this key to store data into memory in databank mode.
 c) Press this key to confirm the setting in setup mode.

- a) Press these keys to enter the desired language.

 - c) In Calculator mode, functions as numeric.

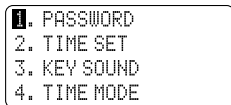
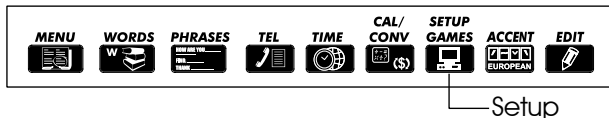
Before starting, please read this instruction manual carefully and be sure to follow the correct operating procedures. Keep this instruction manual for future reference.

TURN ON YOUR GLOBAL TRAVELER - To turn the Global Traveler on, press <ON/OFF>. The device always starts in the mode that was active when it was last turned off. For example, if you were in calculator mode during the last use, you will be in calculator mode again when you turn the Global Traveler back on.

The Global Traveler automatically turns off if no key is pressed for 2 minutes.

SET UP :

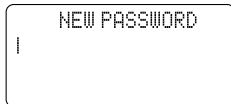
Press SETUP to adjust the basic settings of the Global Traveler. Various options are available in the setup menu. Press once to access settings. Press twice to access Game mode.



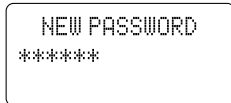
1. PASSWORD:

You can protect your TEL information by inputting your personal password. Before you input the password, make sure you can remember the password, otherwise, your data stored in TEL memory will be locked until you reset your Translator.


1.1 Move the cursor to the PASSWORD and press Enter, or just press <1> to setup your password. Display shows:




1.2 Enter your password (not more than 6 letters): (e.g. A1B2C3), display shows:




1.3 Press <Enter>, display CONFIRM interface, input password (A1B2C3) again:


1.4 Press <Enter> to confirm, display flashed "LOCKED":

1.5 When you confirm the password, you have to input the password when you go into the database <TEL> and displays shows:



1.6 When you enter a correct password, it will release you to the <TEL> mode. If you enter an incorrect password, it will flash "INCORRECT PASSWORD" and ask you to enter the Password again.

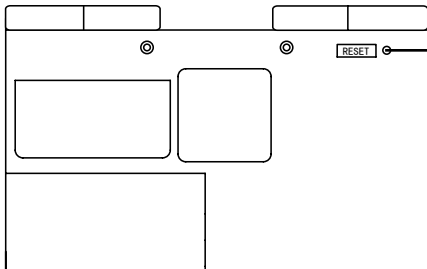
1.7 Release your password, enter to Password in Setup mode.

1.8 Type your password, "A1B2C3", press <ENTER> display flashed "UNLOCKED", the password is released and display returns to previous menu.

1.9 If you forget your password, reset the Global Traveler. In this case, all your data in your TEL memory will be erased.

**NOTE : If you wish to clear all data, or find an abnormal screen which might be with interference by unexpected reasons, you can reset your machine.
When you perform the RESET operation, it will erase all data stored in TEL memory.**



To reset the machine:
Use a thin pointed object
to press the reset hole.

2. TIME SET

2.1 Press <2> to set your LOCAL TIME. The screen displays the local time. There are 200 cities name stored in the translator. Select one city to be your local time.

2.2. Use “Up” (↑) or “Down” (↓) key to search for local city. Or you can type in the first alphabet of the city name and then to search, e.g. press “N” to find the New York, display shows all the cities name which first alphabet is “N”. Press the “Down” (↓) key until New York appears.

2.3. Press “Right” (→) or “Left” (←) key to setup the date and time, e.g. change the date to 03-22-2005 and time at 12:30. Move the cursor by pressing the “Right” (→) key on the month, press the “Up” key until the 03 appears.

2.4. Press “Right” (→) key to move cursor to date, year or time, and change your required time using the same procedure as above.

2.5. Press “ENTER” to store the information entered, display returns to previous menu.

- 2.6 To see Time and World Time, press <Date/Time> key. Press once to see Local Time. Press twice to see World Time. Use “Up” or “Down” (↑↓) key to see World Time, e.g. Type “L” and press “Down” key until London appears.

3. KEY SOUND :

Select to have tone or without tone when you press any key.

- 3.1 Press <3> in setup mode, display shows:

- 3.2 Press “Up” or “Down” (↑↓) key to have tone On, you will find an “↵” icon of the key tone lights on. There is a tone when you press any key.

4. TIME MODE

- 4.1 Press <4> to setup your TIME MODE. i.e. 24-hours or 12-hours format. Display shows:

- 4.2 Use “Up” or “Down” (↑↓) key to select 12HOUR or 24HOUR. Press ENTER to confirm this setting and return to SETUP menu.

5. DATE MODE

- 5.1 Press <5> to set your DATE MODE.
i.e. American format in Month/Date/Year,
or British format in Date/Month/Year, Display shows

- 5.2 Use “Up” or “Down” (↑↓) key to select MM / DD (Month/Date) or DD/MM (Date/Month). Press ENTER to confirm this setting and return to SETUP menu.

6. ALARM SET:


- 6.1. Press <6> in the setup mode, displays shows:

You will find an “🔔” icon of the Alarm on.

- 6.3. Press “left” (←) or “right” (→) key to select HOUR or MINUTE, Press “Up” or “Down” (↑↓) key to setup your time, e.g. 11:15.



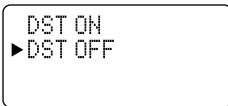

- 6.4. When the alarm sounds, press any key to stop.

7. DAYLIGHT SAVINGS TIME:

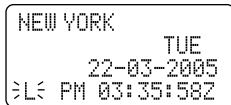
If you are in Summer daylight saving time, select to switch ON the Summer time in your Global Traveler. When you switch ON the Summer time feature, the current time will automatically advance by one hour.

7.1. Press <7> in the setup mode, display shows:



7.2. Press “Up” or “Down” (↑↓) key to select Summer Time ON or OFF.

7.3 After you setup Summer Time ON, you can see an icon “Z” on your local time.
This icon shows adding an hour for Summer time.



8. CONTRAST:

There are 11 levels light or dark display which you can adjust.

8.1 Press <8> in setup mode, the CONTRAST, display shows:

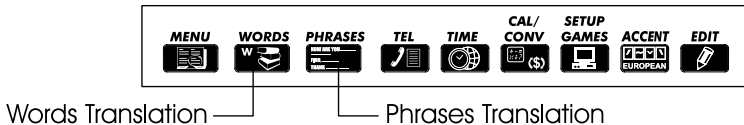


8.2 Press “LEFT” (←) key to decrease contrast, or press “RIGHT” (→) key to increase contrast.

8.3 Press ENTER until you find the optimal display contrast.

USING THE GLOBAL TRAVELER

The Global Traveler contains about 20,000 words plus 2,000 phrases per language. It translates 20 languages instantly.



Words translation

1. Press <Words> key, display 'INPUT ENG:'
2. If you like to input another language, just press the number, e.g. press <3> to input French, press <3> again to input Arabic.

3. Press <1> return to 'Input ENG', type in your word e.g. CAR, press "ENTER", display flashes 'Found: 20' and shows the translation of German 'auto'. It tells you there are 20 words related to 'CAR'

6. If the message is too long, press “Down” (↓) key to see the whole screen.
7. Press Page Down (▼) key to see next word.
8. To enter a new word, just type.
9. If you like to input another language, press <Words> key and select to input another language again.
10. There is a smart system of inflective form to input the European languages. E.g. in English, when you enter “gone”, it can find the RootWord ‘go’ and displays :

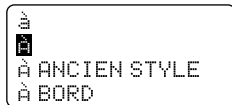

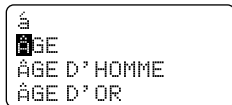

NOTE : The Accent Alphabet can be used only in the European language mode.If you press the “ACCENT” when it is not in a European Language, the display has no response.

Phrases translation:

There are 2000 phrases divided into 16 categories and 147 chapters.

5. The first phrase will appear ‘AIR WAYBILL’ and its translation; press “Page Down “ (▼) key to see the next phrase ‘BILL OF LADING’.

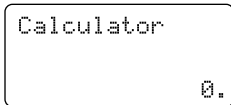

USING THE CALCULATOR

You can use the Global Traveler r to do standard arithmetic, memory and percent calculations to 12 digits.

1. Press once of "CAL/CONV" key into the calculator mode, display shows:
2. Standard calculation, +, -, x, ÷.
3. Memory calculation:
 - (M+) to total a calculation and add the total to memory.
 - (M-) to total a calculation and subtract the total from the value in memory.
 - (MR) to recall or display the value in memory.
 - (MC) to clear the memory.
4. Press "CE" or "AC" to clear display and calculation.



USING THE TEL/MEMO

The Global Traveler databank allows input in all 20 languages. If you need to input the other languages, please select the language to be the entry language in Words or Phrases mode. E.g. If you need to input a Japanese name, you need to go to Words or Phrases mode and change the language to Japanese.

1. INPUT YOUR DATA

1.1 Press function key of "TEL/MEMO", displays shows:



4.5 To delete all the data inside the databank:
In Tel/MEMO mode, Press 3 <Delete all>, display shows:

4.6 Press Y for Yes to delete all data inside, or press N for No. e.g. ‘Y’, display returns to the TEL mode.

4.7 At this stage, when you press 2 <VIEW ITEM> or 3 <DELETE ALL> display flashes to confirm the memory is empty.

USING THE METRIC CONVERTOR

The Global Traveler can convert one type of measurement to another. The following 8 related pairs are built-in the unit and they can be inverse : °C(Celsius) to °F (Fahrenheit) ,M (Metre) to F (Feet), CM (Centimetre) to IN (Inch), L(Litre) to GL(US Gallon), L(Litre) to BG (British Gallon), KB (Kilogram) to LB (Pound),G (Gram) to OZ (Ounce) and A (Are) to AC (Acre).

1. Press CAL/CONV key to go to Conversion mode.
Press once of this function key is the 'CALCULATOR' mode, press twice is the CONV (Conversion) mode.
Displays shows:

```
1. METRIC
2. CURRENCY
3. SIZES
```

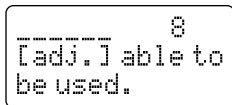
